Course Description

The 2018 BIAK Brain Injury Summit will equip attendees with the latest, evidence-based strategies that address opioid-induced brain injuries from hospital admission to return to the community. They will be able to identify treatment strategies and discover resources to help the person and the family recover from an opioid-induced brain injury to the fullest extent possible. Those attending will also be able to discuss the scope of the opioid epidemic in Kentucky and its impact on Kentucky's Medicaid services, including the Acquired Brain Injury Medicaid Waiver. After attending the BIAK Brain Injury Summit, attendees will be able to...

- Summarize the latest challenges and treatments of opioid-induced brain injury from the first responder to the acute hospital;
- Analyze the evidence-based practices that affect rehabilitation strategies for opioid-induced brain injury in the acute rehabilitation setting;
- Discuss the merits of the strategies to treat opioid-induced brain injury in the community-based rehabilitation setting;
- Assess the impact of opioid-induced brain injury on Kentucky's Medicaid system, including the ABI Medicaid Waiver and the TBI Trust Fund;
- Explain how an understanding of a statistical analysis of Kentucky's opioid-induced brain injuries can help with developing strategies to address the problem of opioid substance use disorder;
- Describe an effective, evidence-based practice to help ABI survivors avoid opioid dependence due to opioid-based prescription drugs post brain injury.

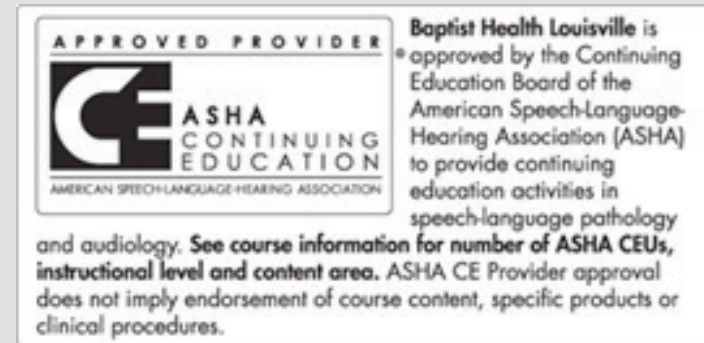

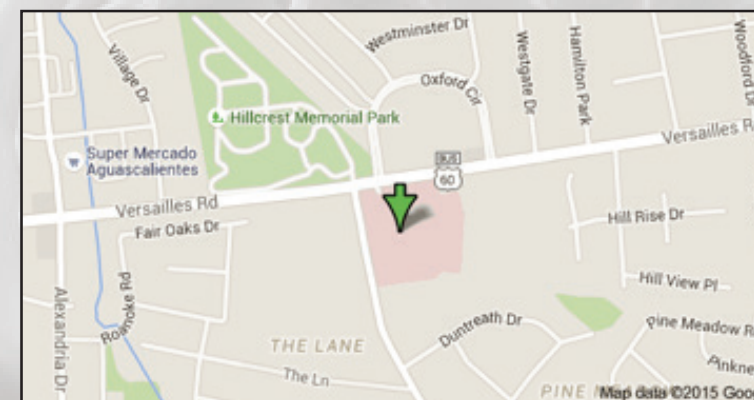
